Northwest Arterial State of Good Repair Project Phase Two Begins

The Northwest Arterial State of Good Repair Project began its second year of construction in March. The project is expected to be substantially completed before school starts in August 2023.

This year, the remaining segments of the northbound lanes from the Catfish Creek Bridge (north of HWY 20) to John F. Kennedy Rd. will be completely reconstructed. This will involve completely removing and replacing the existing pavement. During the project, normal traffic flow will be maintained through the Pennsylvania Ave. and Asbury Rd. intersections while northbound and southbound traffic on the Northwest Arterial will be shifted to head-to-head in the southbound lanes.

Minor traffic impacts are expected at the Asbury Rd. intersection while the curbed median on the south side of the intersection is replaced and three ADA sidewalk ramps are reconstructed.

June is Healthy Homes Month

Each June, healthy housing advocates across the U.S. come together in recognition of National Healthy Homes Month to increase awareness of housing-related health hazards, lead poisoning prevention and the overall principles of a safe and healthy home.

The City of Dubuque Housing & Community Development Department offers financial assistance programs to assist residents in maintaining a healthy, safe, and livable home.

- **Aging in Place Program** for older adults who wish to stay in their home with the help of some home modifications such as handrails, flooring, and step-in showers.

Please note, the following construction schedule may change due to weather conditions.

Late March – Mid-June

In late March, reconstruction began concurrently on two sections of the northbound lanes:

- From the Catfish Creek bridge to just north of Chavenelle Rd.
- Just north of Asbury Rd. to just south of John F. Kennedy Rd.

During this phase, traffic will be shifted head-to-head in the southbound lanes. Access will be maintained at the Chavenelle Rd. and Plaza Dr. intersections. However, the right-in, right-out access to Associates Dr. and the right-in, right-out access road to Sam's Club will be temporarily closed. Reconstruction of these two sections of the arterial is expected to be finished in mid-June.

Mid-June – Mid-August

The northbound lanes, from just north of Pennsylvania Ave. to just south of Asbury Rd., will be the last section reconstructed. Traffic will again be shifted to head-to-head in the southbound lanes for this phase. In addition, access at the Holiday Dr. intersection will be limited to right-in, right-out only. Northbound arterial traffic will need to access Holiday Dr. from Asbury Rd.

Please drive with caution in the project area and obey all traffic detours and posted speed limits during this time.

Partnership Promotes Better Rental Housing in Dubuque

The City of Dubuque has partnered with RentLab to promote energy efficiency, affordability, and sustainability in Dubuque's rental housing sector. The partnership aims to reduce the overall energy cost burden on Dubuque renter households, as lower-income households can pay upwards of 9% of their total income in annual energy costs. Increasing sustainability in local rental units will also be essential in enabling the City to meet its sustainability goals under the 50% by 2030 Community Climate Action and Resiliency Plan. For Landlords and Property Managers

RentLab helps landlords and property managers maximize return on major investments by making sure tenants know how they affect living costs and comfort. Landlords and property managers are encouraged to visit RentLab's website, submit data, and help showcase the benefits of their property. Public data gives a basic picture of every rental property, but that information can miss key details. Low scores may reflect missing – not negative – information. Grants Available to Support Dubuque Neighborhoods

The City of Dubuque Office of Shared Prosperity and Neighborhood Support is accepting applications for the Neighborhood Support Grant Program.

The Neighborhood Grant Program assists neighborhood associations and community groups in Dubuque with improving the quality of life for residents.

Grants are available to groups for up to \$750 for eligible events, projects, and other community initiatives that enhance livability and strengthen neighborhood pride. Previously, neighborhood associations have used funds for projects such as bike racks, a neighborhood newsletter, beautification



efforts, youth and family programs, park improvements, and community gardens.

Applications will be accepted throughout the year and be reviewed on the first of every month. If funding will be utilized for a special event, groups are encouraged to apply for the grant well in advance.

'Right-Size' Your Trash Collection Service NOW


In preparation for the implementation of citywide tipper cart trash collection, the City of Dubuque is encouraging all solid waste collection customers who don't currently have a City-issued cart to consider what size cart they need. **No action is needed by residents who wish to continue with the "basic" 35-gallon service, but those who would like a larger cart should "right-size" their service now.**

The City began delivering the 35-gallon carts in early April customers who do not currently have a city-issued tipper cart. Customers who wish to have a cart larger than the standard 35-gallon cart are encouraged to choose the appropriate size for their needs NOW so they do not receive a 35-gallon cart when those deliveries begin to their neighborhood. Other cart options are: 48-gallon, 64-gallon, and 96-gallon.

To "right-size" your trash cart, visit www.cityofdubuque.org/trashcollection to complete a short form that includes details for each cart size. Residents without internet access can also call 563-589-4250 to request a larger cart. Those who request a cart larger than 35 gallons will receive it after July 1 when supplies become available. They can continue to use their current trash can until the new cart is delivered.

The City is switching to tipper carts to improve efficiency in curbside collections and enhance the safety for staff. Customers will not be charged for the carts beyond their monthly collection fee.

National Health & Nutrition Examination Survey Coming to Dubuque County

The National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey (NHANES) is a program of studies designed to assess the health and nutritional status of adults and children in the United States.



The survey examines a nationally representative sample of about 5,000 persons in 15 counties across the U.S. each year and Dubuque County is one of the counties selected for 2023. NHANES staff will arrive in early May and begin contacting residents throughout the county seeking volunteers to participate in this important program.

The NHANES interview includes demographic, socioeconomic, dietary, and health-related questions. The examination component consists of medical and physiological measurements, as well as laboratory tests administered by highly trained medical personnel.

Findings from this survey are used to determine the prevalence of major diseases and risk factors for diseases. Information will be used to assess nutritional status and its association with health promotion and disease prevention.
