Swim Passes on Sale Now!



Flora and Sutton Pools are scheduled to open on Tuesday, May 28, depending on weather. Pre-season and regular pool hours, including adult swim, open swim, and water playground hours, are available online at www.cityofdubuque.org/pools.

The annual swim pass fee for Dubuque residents is \$42 for youth (4 - 17), \$74 for adults (18 and older), and \$53 for seniors (55 and older). Children age 3 and under are free. Swim passes may be purchased at www.cityofdubuque.org/pools or at the Leisure Services office, located at 1157 Central Ave.

First-time buyers may purchase swim passes online and then visit the Leisure Services office to have their photo taken and pick up the pass. Swim pass renewals do not require a visit to the office. Please note, swim passes will not be sold at the pools. For questions about annual swim passes, call 563-589-4263.

Leisure Services **\$150 FAMILY SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Leisure Services Department provides up to 300 qualifying low-income families with \$150 in scholarship credits for program registration and other services including annual swim passes and swim lessons. Note, scholarship credits may not be used for pool daily admissions. To apply, visit www.cityofdubuque.org/recreation or visit the Leisure Services office.

Swim passes are half-price for low-income individuals who do not have scholarship credits available. For questions, call 563-589-4263.



Each June, healthy housing advocates across the U.S. come together in recognition of National Healthy Homes Month to increase awareness of housing-related health hazards, lead poisoning prevention, and the overall principles of a safe and healthy home.

The City of Dubuque Housing and Community Development Department offers financial assistance programs to assist residents in maintaining a healthy, safe, and livable home.

Age in Place Program



offers grants to Dubuque residents, age 62 and older, to make home modifications such as handrails, flooring, and step-in showers.

Healthy Homes Program addresses hazards including mold, water intrusion, lead paint, allergens, asthma, carbon monoxide, home safety, pesticides, and radon. Program participants may qualify for up to \$10,000 to create a healthier home OR up to \$20,000 for lead remediation plus an additional \$5,000 for other household hazards.

Spring & Summer HYDRANT FLUSHING




The Water Department will conduct fire hydrant flushing throughout the spring and summer months. Flushing is essential for preserving the water system's integrity and maintaining an adequate water supply for Dubuque households and firefighting.

Hydrant flushing may cause temporary inconveniences such as reduced water pressure and water discoloration. Discolored water, although harmless to public health, could potentially stain laundry.

Residents are advised to ensure that all discolored water is flushed out of their home's plumbing and hot water heater before doing laundry.

If you notice discolored water from your fixtures, please flush the water for approximately five minutes or until the water returns to its normal color.

Iowa DOT Construction Projects Impacting Traffic



South Grandview Bridge Replacement

The Iowa Department of Transportation (Iowa DOT) South Grandview Bridge Replacement Project started in March and is expected to be completed in November 2024. Throughout the project, the S. Grandview Ave. bridge will be completely closed to vehicles and pedestrians. Motorists will need to follow the posted detour or use an alternate route. Lane closures beneath the bridge on U.S. 61/151 are also expected.

HWY 61/151 Bridge Deck Overlay

The Iowa DOT HWY 61/151 Bridge Deck Overlay Project over the Peosta Channel is expected to begin in June. The estimated completion date is November 2024. The work will include two phases and will require lane closures on HWY 61/151 from the 9th St./11th St. entrance ramp to Chaplain Schmitt Island. The work will also impact the Kerper Blvd. and 9th St/11th St. entrance and exit ramps. During each phase, motorists will need to follow the posted detour or use an alternate route.
