Unified Development Code Update

The City of Dubuque is updating its Unified Development Code (UDC), which governs zoning, subdivision, and historic preservation regulations. Originally adopted in 2009, the UDC is being thoroughly reviewed and updated to better support the City's evolving goals and priorities, align with other City plans, and to ensure it is not a barrier to development in the community. Public engagement plays a crucial role in this multi-phased, 16-month process, and the City is inviting all residents, property and business owners, and development professionals to share their thoughts and feedback. PROPERTY CODE CHANGES

The City of Dubuque has recently updated its property maintenance code for electrical receptacles and smoke alarms to enhance safety.

GFCI Outlets

All receptacle outlets within 6 ft. of any water source, in all properties including existing buildings, must have ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protection. This safety feature is designed to prevent severe or fatal electric shocks and are required in kitchens, bathrooms, laundry rooms, and any other locations near water sources.

Smoke Alarms

New construction and any remodel that opens walls and/or ceilings requires hardwired smoke alarms. For all other properties, smoke alarms must be either hardwired or permanently sealed, battery-operated models by the following dates:

- **Dec. 23, 2024:** Federally assisted housing units
- **Jan. 1, 2025:** All new and replacement smoke alarms in residential units
- **Jan. 1, 2030:** All properties

WINTER FOOD SCRAPS COLLECTION

December - March

Residents who would like to have yard waste and food scraps collected during the winter months (December - March) can schedule an appointment for their normal trash and recycling day by either submitting a request through the City's website at www.cityofdubuque.org/yardwaste, or calling the Public Works Department at 563-589-4250.

Equitable Community Grants Program

The Office of Equity and Human Rights is accepting applications for the Dubuque Equitable Community Grants Program. Two grants of up to \$5,000 will be awarded to eligible non-profit organizations, businesses, clubs, individuals, or groups of passionate residents to support programs, activities, or services which help promote equity in the Dubuque community. Proposals aimed at serving traditionally underrepresented or underserved populations are encouraged. Grant applications must include an education and/or engagement component. Applications are due Jan. 31. Awarded projects must be completed by April 30, 2025.

A Message from the CITY MANAGER

Season's greetings! As we enter the new year, one of the things I am most grateful for is the return of commercial air service to the Dubuque Regional Airport. In early November, the airport began offering daily jet service to and from Chicago's O'Hare International Airport.

These flights are operated by Denver Air Connection and offer same-day connections to over 200 destinations from O'Hare.



The daily flight originates at O'Hare, departing for Dubuque at 2:30 p.m. Once on the ground in Dubuque by 3:25 p.m., the plane will be cleared and readied for the flight back to O'Hare, which departs at 3:55 p.m. and lands in Chicago by 4:50 p.m.

The afternoon flight times from the airport allow you to have lunch in Dubuque and still be at your destination the same evening or night. That can mean an extra half day of work or other activities before leaving Dubuque, instead of leaving early in the morning to drive an hour and a half or farther to another airport where you'll have to pay to park. On the way back, you won't have to leave your destination super early to make the afternoon flight from O'Hare to Dubuque, and you'll have a short drive home from the airport.

Thanks to Denver Air's ticketing and baggage agreements with American and United (and soon Delta), the connections at O'Hare are seamless. You only need to make one booking, will receive a single ticket, and won't need to do any additional security or luggage check-ins. All of that can be taken care of at our Dubuque Regional Airport, where the parking is free and the lines are short. You can book flights and get more information at www.flydbq.com.

I also have a personal reason for appreciating the new air service provided by Denver Air Connection. My wife, Nancy, travels quite frequently for business and pleasure. She has been leaving the house at 2 a.m., arriving home at 11 p.m., and staying at hotels in Chicago, Cedar Rapids, and the Quad Cities -- being away from home for an extra day due to flight times. Now, she can go to the Dubuque Regional Airport, park for free, relax, and enjoy the trip.

Whether for business or leisure, please consider using the Dubuque Regional Airport. Strong support of this daily service to Chicago and beyond will strengthen our case to add more flights, carriers, and destinations.

ODD/EVEN SNOW ROUTE Policy and Notifications

After significant snowfalls, the City's Odd/Even Snow Route Parking Policy may be enacted. When in effect, parking is prohibited on "even-numbered" sides of streets on even days of the month and on "odd-numbered" sides of streets on odd days of the month.

Citizen's Police Academy

Applications Due Friday, Jan. 10

The Dubuque Police Department will hold the 28th annual Citizen's Police Academy (CPA) on Thursdays from 6 - 9:30 p.m. from Jan. 30 through April 3.



The CPA is a 10-week program and participants are strongly encouraged to commit to attending all sessions. CPA sessions are taught by local law enforcement professionals and other members of the criminal justice system. Each session covers a variety of topics, including arrest procedures, search and seizure, use of force, laws and policies, police procedures, domestic abuse cases, sexual abuse cases, drug enforcement, OWIs, officer safety, and prevention programs.

Participants must be at least 18 years of age with no felony convictions and no significant arrest history. Space is limited. Applications are due Friday, Jan. 10, and can be found at www.cityofdubuque.org/cpa. Paper applications are available at the Dubuque Police Department, 770 Iowa St.

Preference will be given to Dubuque residents. The CPA does not certify participants as law enforcement officers.
