# Dubuque Recognized Nationally & Internationally INTHIS ISSUE

Dubuque is the top-ranked city on Forbes' list of "The Best Small Cities to Raise a Family."

The listing ranked cities with populations under 100,000 by quality of life measures that make living easier for families such as education level, median household income, rate of home ownership, housing affordability, and average commute time.

The article on Forbes.com states, "Dubuque's size puts it in kind of a sweet spot: large enough to be a center of industry, small enough to not be overcrowded. An economy that diversified after the collapse of local manufacturing industry contributes to an unemployment rate that's nearly half the national average at 6.5 percent, and a median household income of \$48,779. That means most families have the jobs they need. They also don't have to spend a lot of time getting there: Only 2.6 percent of the population spends an hour or more getting to work."

Dubuque was named a third-place finalist and a gold standard community at the International Awards for Livable Communities (LivCom) held in Chicago in November.

Finalists were divided into five categories based on population. Dubuque was the highest-ranked American city in the "whole city" category for communities with populations up to 75,000. Criteria for the awards were based on each community's demonstration of enhancement of the landscape, heritage management, environmentally sensitive practices, community sustainability, healthy lifestyles, and planning for the future.

"It's an incredible honor for Dubuque," said Mayor Roy D. Buol. "It's one thing to be compared to communities in the United States. This is getting recognized globally. It doesn't get much better than that, and it speaks volumes about where this city is and where it's headed."

### Airport Ranked Best in the Nation for Safety Compliance

The Dubuque Regional Airport recently received official notice of its 20th consecutive year of perfect compliance with Federal Aviation Regulation (FAR) Part 139. FAR Part 139 governs safety standards for airfield operations, safety, and maintenance at airports served by commercial airlines. This acknowledgment means the Dubuque airport meets or exceeds all federally mandated standards, rules, and policies which promote safety at all commercial airports. No other airport in the country has a perfect FAR Part 139 safety compliance record for a consecutive 20-year period!

### American Airlines Adds Fourth Flight

American Airlines and the Dubuque Regional Airport have added a fourth daily flight to Chicago O'Hare beginning on April 5, 2011. ## Van Milligen Named National Academy Fellow

Dubuque City Manager Michael C.Van Milligen was recently named a National Academy of Public Administration (NAPA) Fellow by the Academy's board of directors.

"As a NAPA Fellow, I am going to have the opportunity to learn from the best and brightest in public administration in the world," said Van Milligen. "This is a humbling honor and I hope I can make some small contribution to their work."

To be selected as a NAPA Fellow, individuals must be nominated by three existing Fellows, be recommended for consideration by a nominating committee of existing Fellows, and then be elected

by a vote of all Fellows. There are approximately 700 NAPA Fellows. Van Milligen is one of just 72 current or former city or county managers elected to the group.

The NAPA is an independent, non-partisan organization created by Congress to help public sector leaders meet the important and varied management challenges of today and anticipate those of the future. The NAPA undertakes its work on behalf of the public sector by anticipating, evaluating, analyzing and making recommendations on the nation's most critical and complex public management, governance, policy and operational challenges. ### Yard Lighting Rebate Program Expanded

The Dubuque City Council has approved the expansion of the City's yard lighting rebate program to include neighborhoods east of the bluffs area as well the city's low/moderate income neighborhoods.

The lighting initiative was developed to enhance public safety and allows property owners in these areas to apply for a partial rebate of the purchase and installation costs of energy-efficient lighting fixtures for their front and/ or backyard. The program was first offered in the Washington Neighborhood in 2008. The expansion follows a recommendation of the Safe Community Task Force for the City to create ways to encourage people to light up their own property and surrounding public property.

For front yard lighting, property owners are eligible for a rebate of up to half of \$500 (\$250 maximum) toward the cost of purchase and installation of energy-efficient electric, gas, or permanent solar lighting fixtures installed. The light fixture must be in close proximity to the public sidewalk and at least partially light the public sidewalk.

Property owners are also eligible for a rebate of up to half of \$200 (\$100 maximum) toward the cost of purchase and installation of energy-efficient electric, gas, or permanent solar lighting fixtures installed in their back yard. The light fixtures may also be attached to the rear of the home or to the owner's garage on the alley. The light fixture must be in close proximity to the alley and at least partially light the alley. Motion-sensitive lighting fixtures and fixtures using incandescent bulbs are not eligible. City permits and inspections by the Building Services Department are required for this program.

### Transit Adds 'Medical Loop'

Dubuque's Keyline Transit now offers riders a new "Medical Loop" route. The loop provides hourly service between the Finley Hospital, Mercy Medical Center, Medical Associates Clinic (East Campus only), as well as Clarke University, Loras College, the University of Dubuque, and the Hy-Vee Food Store on South Locust Street. Passengers can access the service from the other Keyline bus lines at the 6th and lowa transfer point at 45 minutes past the hour between the hours of 7:45 a.m. and 4:45 p.m.

Keyline's standard fare structure applies to the Medical Loop: \$1.00 per ride for the general public; \$0.50 for senior citizens, students 17 and under, and persons with disabilities; and no charge for transfers.
