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## **Public Information Meeting for 9th, 10th, and 11th Streets One-Way to Two-Way Conversion Project**

DUBUQUE, Iowa – The City of Dubuque Engineering Department will hold a public information meeting at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, April 3, on the conversion of 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> Streets from one-way to two-way traffic. The meeting will be held in the Aigler Auditorium at the Carnegie-Stout Public Library, 360 W. 11th Street, and is open to the public. Business owners/operators and residents near the project area are strongly encouraged to attend.

In February 2009, the City Council adopted the Historic Millwork District Master Plan, a project that involves the utilization of one million square feet of underdeveloped space in the areas of: Jackson Street, between 7<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> Streets; 10th Street, between Jackson Street and Elm Street; 10th Street, from Main Street to Jackson Street; and Washington Street, between 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> Streets. The Historic Millwork District Master Plan also identifies that 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> Streets should be converted to two-way traffic. The public meeting on April 3 will offer information on the results of a downtown traffic study; the proposed improvements to 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> Streets to accommodate the conversion from one-way to two-way traffic; the project timeline; and project funding.
