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City Hall Tuck Pointing Project to Affect West Entrance

DUBUQUE, Iowa – City Hall’s west entrance on Iowa Street will be closed for three weeks beginning July 3 to complete the next phase of a tuck pointing project. However, this entrance will still be available by request for mobility-challenged individuals requiring the use of a ramp.

Beginning July 3, individuals requiring use of City Hall’s ADA-compliant entrance on the west side are asked to approach an on-ground R&W Restoration employee to temporarily stop work to allow access. Individuals not requiring the ramp are asked to use City Hall’s other entrances on the north and east sides.

The tuck pointing project at Dubuque’s City Hall began April 29, starting with the east side, as preventative maintenance to the 156-year-old building. R&W Restoration of Dubuque is the project contractor and was the lowest bidder on the project, at \$188,000. The tuck pointing project includes mortar joint and brick repair and replacement as well as window sill repair and replacement. By mid-July, work will begin on the north side of City Hall along 13th Street, requiring the closure of that entrance and impacting metered parking spaces for six to seven weeks.
