Mayor Buol to Join Nationwide Effort to Recognize Impact of National Service

Dubuque, Iowa— Dubuque Mayor Roy D. Buol will join more than 1,825 mayors across the country in celebrating the third annual Mayors Day of Recognition for National Service, a nationwide bipartisan effort to highlight the impact of national service in tackling city problems.

The Dubuque National Service Partnership invites the public to attend the Mayors Day of Recognition for National Service event on Tuesday, April 7, from 1:00-3:00 p.m. at the Diamond Jo Harbor Room (301 Bell Street). Mayor Buol will honor local nominees and present awards to the recipients of the Mayors Day of Recognition for National Service Awards in the categories of Champion of Service and Impact. The winners were selected from the nominees reviewed by the Dubuque National Service Partnership.

The Champion of Service Award was created to honor individuals and agencies working with National Service members. The Dubuque Champion of Service Award will be presented to Jack Frick, a volunteer at the Dubuque Arboretum & Botanical Gardens through the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program. Frick was nominated by Sue Lemon, Volunteer Coordinator at the Dubuque Arboretum and Botanical Gardens. Lemon said, "Jack inspires and leads the way for hundreds of dedicated volunteers to aspire to follow in his footsteps." The Dubuque Arboretum and Botanical Gardens relies on over 100 RSVP volunteers each year.

The Impact Award is designed to honor those National Service members that go above and beyond their call of service. The Dubuque Impact award will be presented to Nick Coleman, an AmeriCorps member with Iowa Campus Compact serving with Duhawk Dance Marathon. Coleman was nominated by Maggie Baker, Service Learning Coordinator at Loras College. Baker said, "Coleman and his fellow classmates at Loras College coordinate an event each year that has had a profound impact on the lives of thousands of children throughout Iowa and which provides year-round support for families in Dubuque."

The Dubuque National Service Partnership is a collaborative effort of Corporation for National and Community Service programs in Dubuque including a variety of AmeriCorps and Senior Corps programs. The Dubuque National Service Partnership members are service providers including RSVP, Foster Grandparent Program, AmeriCorps Partners in Learning, Iowa Campus Compact—Loras College, City of Dubuque, Community Foundation of Greater Dubuque, United Way and other community organizations.
