

New License Fees- FAQ

Temporary Food and Farmers Market Licenses



Q: Did the Farmers Market License fee change?

A: Yes, the fee is now \$150 and will be renewed annually. *This only applies to vendors selling Time-Temperature Controlled for Safety (TCS) foods at a Farmers Market. License is valid in the county it was purchased.*

Q: Have Temporary Food License fees increased?

A: Yes, each temporary food license is \$50.

Q: When do the new fees take effect?

A: January 1st, 2019

Q: Can I get a seasonal or annual temporary food license?

A: Yes, an Annual Temporary Food License will be \$200. This is a county-wide license that will be renewed annually from the date the license is issued.

Q: Who can get an Annual Temporary Food License?

A: Any temporary food operator planning to operate at multiple food events within a county in a 12-month period. The license is valid in the county it was purchased.

Q: Can an Annual Temporary Food License be used at Farmers Market?

A: Yes, vendors that operate at both farmers market and temporary food events may get an annual Temporary Food License and it will allow them to operate at farmers market and all temporary food events within the county that the license is issued for. This license is renewed annually, and the fee is \$200. Operators are required to follow the temporary food license rules.

Q: Are there additional requirements/licenses for food event organizers?

A: Yes, for events with more than 10 temporary food vendors (not including mobile units, fairs or farmers market), the event organizer is required to submit a temporary event license application to the City of Dubuque Health Services Department at least 60 days prior to the event. The cost is \$50.
