NEW BUSINESS

What are the expectations for educating and collaborating with the public? Since the general public has limited exposure and knowledge of art it is important to provide information about the art through diverse strategies. Information needs to be provided at all stages of the process from selection of an artist and actual design through the execution of the project and ongoing after completion to welcome new viewers into the dialog. The permanent nature of public art requires that community neighborhoods gain an understanding of the art in their midst and to assist the art to become a part of the fabric of the neighborhood and city.

Previously Discussed:

1. *What kind of strategies need to be employed to inform the selection committee of each project?*
2. *During the planning stages, how will the immediate audience (neighborhood, institution, public representatives) be introduced to the specific range of concepts of art represented in their individually proposed public art.*

Current Discussion:

For public art that requires extensive construction in public view because of its inherent fabrication process or extensive site design, how will the public be informed and engaged about the process and ideas that are occurring and expressed?

At completion of the public art projects, what kind of programming and other educational support will be utilized to enhance the public's understanding and receptiveness to their communities new art.

What long-term educational resources and social engagements will be offered to help increase community connection to Dubuque's growing public art and introduce new transplanted families to the cultural significance of the art in their everyday experience.
