

CITY OF DUBUQUE, IA  
INCOME GUIDELINES FOR  
FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Income limits are defined and occasionally revised by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's estimated median family income.

A moderate-income person or family has a total income which falls between the fifty (50) percent and eighty (80) percent median for the area, adjusted for size.

A low-income person, family, or household has a total income which falls between thirty (30) and fifty (50) percent of the median income, adjusted for size, of the metropolitan area.

An extremely low-income person, family or household has a total income which is between zero (0) and thirty (30) percent of the median income, adjusted for size, of the metropolitan area.

The maximum income limits as of June 1, 2025 for the Dubuque Metropolitan Statistical Area are as follows:
